Green Badge

For those just starting out, who've embraced the adventure by delving into up to 5 books

Purple Badge

Awarded to students who've surpassed the initial stage, conquering 5 to 10 books with enthusiasm

Orange Badge

Recognizing the evolving tastes and exploration of diverse literature, for those who've explored up to 15 books across genres, authors, and poets.

Satya Blue Badge of 'Reading Maestro' and a Certificate

Reserved for the dedicated readers who have immersed themselves in 20 books or more, showcasing a true love for reading. Also, the winner would be entitled to buy books worth INR 500/- from the book fair organised by the school.

Remember!

To qualify for any of the aforementioned badges, students must have successfully cleared the verbal assessments taken up by the librarian and teachers during the year. In case of any conflict, the decision of the senior leadership team will be the final.

We urge parents to actively engage in this challenge by reading alongside your child and/or engaging in discussions about the books. Your participation plays a pivotal role in ensuring the success of this endeavour and fostering a lifelong passion for reading in our students.

How does it work

Reading List

A curated list of books for each age group is available at the school library and more are being procured, which the children can get issued over the year. Moreover the children also have the liberty of choosing age-appropriate books from their own collection.

Number of books

The students are required to read at least 20 books in a year. To begin with, we have ensured every child gets an age-appropriate book issued from the library followed by self-chosen books. The reading of minimum 2 books is mandatory during the summer break.

Reading Log

Maintain a reading log in the almanac and get the same signed by the HRT/Librarian

Weekly Check-ins

Students will meet with their librarian during the scheduled library hours to discuss the books and share their insights once a month.

Check-ups

We shall have various engagements organized based on the comprehension strategies, during the year to sustain and nurture the love for reading.

Celebrating the achievement

The readers will be celebrated every month in the class based on the numbers of books read during the month and interaction with the librarian.
